



Our Program

The C.R.E.A.T.E. Hope Program provides treatment and advocacy services to child victims of crime and their non-offending caregivers free of charge. Children (4-18 years old) served by the C.R.E.A.T.E. Hope Program have been victimized or witnessed crimes such as physical/sexual/emotional abuse, domestic violence, severe neglect, assault, human trafficking, and/or other violent crimes.

Our program uses a trauma-informed, wrap-around approach that promotes stabilization and healing through evidence-based treatments and support for child victims and their non-offending caregivers. Licensed clinicians provide treatment and support services that are tailored to meet the unique and individual needs of each child and family.



Treatment Services

- Trauma-informed Assessment and Treatment Planning
- Evidence-based individual therapy for children
- Caregiver support group
- Child victim support group
- Family therapy
- Crisis intervention
- 24/7 on call support from Clinician Advocates



Support and Advocacy Services

- Child and family needs assessment
- Crisis planning and safety planning
- Referral and linkage to needed community resources and providers
- Parenting education and support
- Multi-disciplinary team approach with all providers, agencies, and supports involved with child and family
- Education, support, and assistance navigating legal processes and understanding victim/witness rights
- Wrap-around case management for stabilization and recovery

Admissions Criteria

- Children (ages 4-18) who reside in Bladen, Columbus, Robeson, Pender and surrounding counties who have been a victim of a crime and/or witnessed criminal acts
- Crimes must have been reported to law enforcement and/or department of social services
- Eligible child victims must be able to function in a home setting (*home, foster home or Residential program*)
- Participation of a non-offending caregiver

- Non-offending caregivers (*biological parents, adoptive parents, legal guardians*)
